With the increase in numbers of students attending Melville Senior High School, parking and traffic jams are occurring. What can be done to ease your congestion?

Parking

If you need to visit the school, try to avoid drop off and pick up times if possible. Parking can be found by driving in the direction of the red line on the map below ——————

- The staff car park CANNOT be entered to drop students at school.
- Year 12 students must have a parking pass available from Student Services displayed in their car and cannot park on school grounds.

Parents who drop off:

- If you drive along Leach Hwy off, consider dropping students south in Winnacott St at the overpass (students must use the footbridge and you can avoid the traffic in Potts St). ① Or drop off north in Joiner St ②
- If you drive via Marmion St, make the drop off a few blocks from the school to avoid traffic right outside the school. Challenger Pde off Marmion has a walkway through to Potts St 4
- Encourage walking, riding or bus.
- Why not drop your child at one of the bus stops? Most of the buses drop the students outside the school or at the overpass so they don't have to cross a single road.

Buses

Many students use the good public transport routes to get to school. The buses leave from:

- Fremantle Station (via Marmion St) or via Watkins St, White Gum Valley
- Bull Creek Train Station (via Leach Hwy Winthrop and Booragoon
- Munster (via Marvell Ave, Newton St, Rockingham Rd Spearwood/Carrington St Hamilton Hill and Hilton) or via Marmion St Booragoon and Melville
- Canning Bridge Como (via Reynolds Mt Pleasant, Coomoora Rd and Davy St Booragoon/ Northlake Rd Myaree/ Winnacott\ St Willagee)
- Kwinana/Spearwood (Rockingham Rd/ Connects with bus from Munster)

Riding Bikes

- Bike racks are available within school grounds and are gated during school hours. A new bike wrack zone is being investigated
- · Please remind students to ride safely and follow road rules.

Traffic Obstruction Infringements

Melville City Council reminds commuters to keep within the road rules on where to drop, stop and park. Rangers will be extra vigilant during peak hours. Please take note of yellow lines on the road that denote no stopping. Infringements:

- 26. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle so that any portion of the vehicle is
 - a) in front of a right of way, passage or private drive or so close to one as to deny vehicles reasonable access to, or egress from, the right of way, passage or private drive;
 - b) upon an intersection except adjacent to a carriageway boundary that is broken by an intersecting carriageway;
 - c) within 6.0 metres of the nearest property line of any thoroughfare intersecting the thoroughfare on the side on which the vehicle is standing or parked;
 - d) alongside any hoarding, scaffolding, obstacle or impediment for pedestrians; or
 - e) on or over a footpath or a place of refuge for pedestrians
 - Double Parking
- 27. A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on a thoroughfare so that any portion of the vehicle is between any vehicle which is parked or standing on a carriageway of that thoroughfare and the centre of that thoroughfare.

 Verge Parking
- 28. (1) A person shall not stand or park a vehicle on a street verge where signs prohibit the standing or parking of vehicles on that verge.
 - (2) A person, not being the occupier of the land abutting on to a street verge, shall not without consent of that occupier, drive, park or stand a vehicle upon that verge.
